I hope everyone had a great holiday season and were able to spend time with family and friends. It's going to be a busy year in the Village.

The Village Planning Commission and Village Council will begin reviewing the ordinance book to update the Village ordinances. We will also be installing new water meters to replace our aging meters. We should be beginning the installations in May and continue through the summer. We will have more information on that later as we get closer to installation time. We will also be finishing up our master plan in order to position ourselves for an infrastructure grant to finish our streetscape on the south end of First Street and to build the industrial park road.

From the Treasurer's Desk—IT'S TAX TIME!!!

In past years, Village taxes had to be paid to Berrien County after September 14th. This is the first collection season that residents can pay their property taxes at the Village Office after the September due date. The Village can accept your property tax payments until February 28th. After February 28th, we have to turn any outstanding taxes over to Berrien County for collection.

Once the taxes go to the County, the interest rate on the outstanding balance goes from 1% to up to 18%. Save yourself some time and money and come visit us at the Village Office before February 28th.



Park Reservations

Reservations for the Village Park for 2017 may be made by calling the Village Office at 422-1779.



There is no charge to village residents to reserve the park, however, there is a refundable \$20 key deposit required for each day. A \$25 rental fee will be charged to all non-Village residents. Keys must be picked up by Thursday prior to the date you have the park reserved and be returned by the following Monday.



If you want to reserve Hess Lake Park or the Fire Station Hall, you must call the Township Office at 422-2300.
