Hopefully everyone is dry and didn't have much water damage. This is the first time I remember the park being under water in over 40 years! Even the ducks didn't want to be in the creek as it was moving so fast!

As we approach spring, I have just a few things I would ask you to keep in mind. Always check the Village ordinances before you do any remodeling or additions. Sheds and accessory buildings are regulated as well. Please check the ordinances before you purchase a shed or accessory building. The soft sided garages are not allowed by ordinance. You can find all of our ordinances on our website, or you can come in to the office for copies of them. It is the easiest way to avoid any additional fees or costs.

The DPW staff have about 80 more water meters to install. They have done a great job of working to get them completed. The goal is to have them all installed by the end of May. Remember, the old meters were very inefficient and most were inaccurate, so there is a chance that your water bill may go up. On the flipside, it may go down!

Mowing season is fast approaching. The DPW crew will pick up yard waste as long as it is placed in some sort of receptacle, preferably a garbage can or a similar container. Pick up is usually on Friday morning so the Village will look nice for the weekend.

New Garage Sale Ordinance

Spring is just around the corner and time for garage sales to begin. In brief, here are the highlights:

- ⇒ Three days is the maximum time limit for one sale.
- ⇒ Three sales per location per calendar year.
- ⇒ A permit must be obtained from the Clerk's Office (there is no charge to hold a garage sale).
- ⇒ Signs may be put up, but must be removed after the sale period.
- ⇒ All sale items MUST be stored indoors from 9:00 p.m. - 7:00 a.m.

The ordinance may be viewed in full online or at the Village Office.

Park Reservations

Reservations for the Village Park for 2018 may be made by calling the Village Office at 422-1779.

NEW THIS YEAR: There is a \$25 rental fee for Village residents, and a \$50 fee for non-Village residents. Groups of 50 or larger will be charged \$75.

As always, there is a refundable \$20 key deposit is also required. Keys must be picked up at the Village Office by Thursday prior to the date you have the park reserved and be returned or left in the drop box at the Municipal Building within three (3) days after reserved date.
