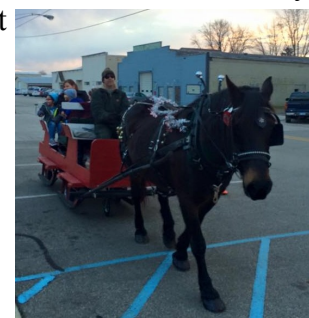

Pets in the Village

New Garage Sale Ordinance

Spring is just around the corner and time for garage sales to begin. In brief, here are the highlights:

- 1) Three days is the maximum time limit for one sale.
- 2) Three sales per location per calendar year.
- 3) A permit must be obtained from the Clerk’s Office (there is no charge to hold a garage sale).
- 4) Signs may be put up, but must be removed after the sale period.
- 5) All sale items MUST be stored indoors from 9:00 p.m. - 7:00 a.m.



The ordinance may be viewed in full online or at the Village Office.

Park Reservations

Reservations for the Village Park for 2016 may be made by calling the Village Office at 422-1779.



There is no charge to village residents to reserve the park, however, there is a refundable \$20 key deposit required for each day. A \$25 rental fee will be charged to all non-Village residents. Keys must be picked up by Thursday prior to the date you have the park reserved and be returned by the following Monday.



If you want to reserve Hess Lake Park or the Fire Station Hall, you must call the Township Office at 422-2300.
